Orza translates as bringing the boat toward the wind. It has been, in fact, our purpose for decades to bring hundreds of teens and kids from 8 to 18 years to the most thrilling sailing adventure.

SAILING IN PORTOPOLLO, SARDINIA. A SAILING PARADISE

We will host you in a wonderful nautical base in Porto Pollo Bay, near Palau in the north of Sardinia. This is a renowned spot for water sports due to the constant presence of wind. During the residential courses the students sail in the bay where the waves are almost non-existent.

Because of its proximity to both Bocche di Bonifacio and Maddalena archipelago National Park, it's the perfect starting point for itinerant courses that take you to the gorgeous Lavezzi and Cavallo into the south of Corse.

TRAVELING AND SAILING ALWAYS ACCOMPANIED

Your kids are never left alone. As the kids participate in the sailing activities, their instructors follow them, while the adult companion ensures their safety and comfort during the free time.

The school organizes a trip to our nautical base for under-18s from Milan, Genova or Olbia.

While on the trip, the kids are always with an adult companion. It is possible to organize the trip from other cities for large groups.

FROM 8 TO 18 YEARS, ALWAYS WITH FRIENDS OF THEIR AGE

Kids are grouped together in bedrooms based on age and gender. This will also be considered when determining the courses and sailing teams.

SAFETY IS A SAILOR'S FIRST RULE

Our courses are kept in full safety conditions. buoyancy aids, and helmets on the first dinghy course, are mandatory. The students sail on boats that are easy to handle and appropriate for children's technical knowledge and athletic abilities.

NUTRITION AND EMERGENCY CARE

Those with nutritional requirement (vegetarians, vegans, allergic or intolerants) can request a separate menu.

Our boats have first aid kits and our base has a DAE at our disposal in case of an emergency.

Our staff is ready to intervene or call for immediate medical help.

We care about the environment, both at sea and on land. Since 2013, our structure has been certified class A, which features a photovoltaic system, a thermal solar system, thermal coatings, thermal break windows with double glazing, and heat pumps. Furthermore, we are very strict with recycling both at the base and on our cabin boats. We bring home everything non-biodegradable and use biodegradable soap.

Thanks to the water purifier we have eliminated plastic bottles, bring your own water bottle!

ORZA'S TEACHING METHOD

LEARNING BY DOING, HOW DOES IT WORK?

The learning experience is transformed into a playful one by "learning by doing." We aim to give our students small problems that are designed to be easily overcome.

his way the sailing experience is fun and helps everyone gain courage, including to the shyest kids.

A theoretical lecture sets every day, manageable goals leaving room for experimentation.

The instructor's role is to make learning easier by giving stimuli in


the right direction to lead the student to deductive learning. In the second lesson of the day, the concepts are fixed, and the debriefing is used to rationalize what happened in the morning. The students themselves answer the questions left unanswered in the morning and allow the instructor to give them supplementary information if need.

The courses are not excessively tiring especially at the base levels and are designed to let our students have fun while learning.





EVERITHING ON ORZA'S COURSES

OUR COURSES: DAY TO DAY

All courses begin on Saturday at 1 pm with a briefing session where they meet the staff and learn about life at the base and safety procedures. Courses end Friday after and the end-of-course meeting between participants and staff. Everyone is free to leave at 5 pm.

THE STATIONARY COURSES

On the first afternoon, everybody get familiar with the boats while the sailing instructors check out technical levels of all participants. The other days the students sail for about 6 h a day with a lunch break at the base (children's courses are usually shorter).

After breakfast, we start at 9 am with a theoretical lecture explaining the daily goals. Afterwords once the boats are rigged, we start sailing. After the lunch break there is a brief lesson at 3pm, then we sail until 6pm.

Then it's time to relax! For teens there is the possibility to have a small alcohol-free aperitif once or twice a week. Dinner at 20:30 pm and then some free time under the assistance of Orza staff before everybody go to sleep.

THE ITINERANT COURSES

The first afternoon of Saturday is dedicated to organizing the course, loading the food, equipment and provisions and preparing the boats for the cruise. We generally set sail in the late afternoon on Saturday (weather and sea conditions permitting) and that same evening we reach a nearby bay where we can spend the first night moored. In itinerant courses, a precise routine is not followed, but each day alternates navigation, teaching and moments of relaxation and is organized by the instructors based on the weather, the distance to travel, and the educational objectives. Meals are prepared and consumed on board with the galley provided.

Most of the days also include a stop for lunch and there is no shortage of moments of leisure, swimming in the turquoise water and the possibility of going ashore for small excursions. In the evening the boats moor close together in sheltered bays where they all spend the night together.

On Friday morning the boats return to the Porto Pollo bay, the day continues with disembarkation, boat cleaning and lunch at the base.

ARE YOU A GOOD SAILOR? BECOME AN ORZA INSTRUCTOR

We take care of talented little sailors, pointing out their ability to mum and dad and offering them a career as a sailing instructor.

The training courses can be attended from 15 years of age. The stages include courses to become an assistant instructor, weeks of coaching in the field as an assistant instructor and, upon turning 18, access to formal courses for the instructor's license.


BEGINNER DINGHY COURSE

Residential - one week course Boats: Tridente '14

For first timers or less experienced sailors.

Dinghies are simple, intuitive boats. They allow the participants to develop a sensitivity to the wind and the boat's reaction. With this course the students learn to helm, to be the bowman and to autonomously enter and exit from a mooring.

OBJECTIVES: nomenclature, knots, setting of the boat, capsizing, sailing gaits, tacking, jibing, maneuvers of entering and exiting sailing from the beach, mobility and conduction.





DINGHY IMPROVEMENT COURSE

Residential - one week course Boats: 420 - Rs Quest

For those who did the 2nd level or are very good on dinghies.

Now that your kids are truly little sailors, tacking, gybing and conduction are a given. Helm and bowman (trapeze) work as a crew towards perfecting the trim of the boat, predicting puffs and, with the introduction of VMG, windward and broad reaching are now a strategy. Then we surf with spinnaker or gennaker!

OBJECTIVES: trapeze, rolling tacking and gybing, surfing gybing, spinnaker/gennaker (equipping, conduction, hoisting, hauling down, gybing), trim, VMG, steering during windward and broad reaching under gust, "S" way while broad reaching.






INTERMEDIATE DINGHY COURSE

Residential - one week course Boats: 420 - RS Feva - RS Quest

For those who did the 1st level or have previous dinghy experience.

During the second level the basilar concepts are reviewed: tacking and gibing stop being a change in direction, helming stop meaning to just go onwards! Now tacking with low wind condition involves rolling. Gibing becomes a precise maneuver. We start exploring the spinnaker or gennaker. The helm and bowman become two new worlds to discover!

OBJECTIVES: using the trapeze, roll tacking, gybing from broad reaching to broad reaching, surfing, going windward and tacking, equipping gennaker and spinnaker (hauling, hoisting, use), tips on regatta.





ASYMMETRICAL SKIFF COURSE

Residential - one week course Boats: ski 29er - RS500

For whom did the 3rd level.

Skiffs are lightweight surfing boats equipped with large sails that are excitingly fast. The participants learn a new approach to sailing made of extreme trim, reactivity, and velocity. Riding them is an exciting experience, and after the first capsizes you will no longer be able to do without it!

OBJECTIVES: position and movements onboard, surfing vs displacement, gybing with gennaker, trim and weight handling, apparent and true wind, steering during windward and broad reaching and "S", bearing away on skiffs, handling lateral trim.





INTERMEDIATE O'PEN SKIFF COURSE

Residential - one week course Boats: O'pen Skiff

For those who did the 1st level or have previous dinghy experience.

For little sailors who wish to be on a boat alone for the first time. A modern version of the traditional Optimist allows the pupils to surf. Some speed coupled with some play-regatta, capsizing without risk and without fear on board a small, truly high-performance dinghy that sparks the envy of older companions.

OBJECTIVES: nomenclature, setting of the boat, level running, maneuvers, conduction of windward and stern wind, surfing, acceleration under gust.





SKIFF PERFORMANCE COURSE

Residential - one week course Boats: 29er - 29er XX



The time has come for your kids to really start taming their skiff, they will learn how to bring the boat to its full potential. The focus is on speed, performance, and maximal efficiency of the movements.

After a few capsizing the personal talents come to light!!

OBJECTIVES: fine work on bowman and helm roles, steering using weight, rolling tacking and gybing, surf keeping, windward surfing, VMG in windward and broad reaching, performance.



Two-weeks course: dinghy + keel boat

The most thrilling and educational of Orza's courses which teaches your kids so much, bringing them back to land a little more mature, more grown up, more sailors!

Nature and adventure, cruising in its purest form.



COASTAL NAVIGATION COURSE

Residential/itinerant - 2 weeks course Boats: Tridente - 420 - Nytec 23

Level 1: for first timers or less experienced sailors. Level 2: for those who did the 1st level or have previous experience.

Welcome to the Coastal Navigation course, the most beloved among the Orza courses, which brings joy to both parents and children. In just two weeks, it provides truly comprehensive training! The magical formula of these fourteen days combines high-level educational content with the beauty of cruising. It takes your young sailors first onto dinghies to gain experience, and then onto cabin cruisers to learn life onboard and maneuvering exclusively under sail, a crucial skill for those who aspire to become skilled sailors.

During the first week, while stationed at the base with overnight stays, your youngsters learn on small and safe boats. They navigate the sheltered waters of the gulf, practicing with the tiller and sheets, always under the watchful eye of instructors on safety vessels. Mornings are spent at sea for practical training, with a break for lunch, followed by more water-based fun until late afternoon. After a week ashore, they set sail for the itinerant week onboard the Nytec 23, they embark on magical days among the islands and harbours of the Bonifacio Strait and the National Park of the Maddalena Archipelago. Here, they discover the sea, nature, and adventure the purest and most captivating form of cruising. Each boat accommodates three students and their instructor, island-hopping during the day and spending nights in protected bays. The boats, moored close together under the starry sky, become one large home on

And tomorrow, they're off to another destination!

In addition to sailing and coastal navigation, the course offers moments of leisure, land excursions, and all the beauty of flotilla nautical camping. The experience during the second week on cabin cruisers builds upon what was learned in the first week and delves into new topics, such as life onboard, mutual respect, and teamwork. But above all, it provides an unforgettable experience and a good dose of awareness, autonomy, and maturity. After the Coastal Navigation course, your youngsters' eyes will know how to look farther ahead.

FIRST LEVEL OBJECTIVES:

During the first week the course is held on the Trident 14: nomenclature, knots, setting of the boat, capsizing, sailing gaits, tacking, jibing, maneuvers of entering and exiting sailing from the beach, mobility and conduction. During the second week the kids go cruising: reefing, navigation in safety, life as a crew, mooring and anchoring basics, hints of pilotage.

SECOND LEVEL OBJECTIVES:

During the first week the course is held on the 420, RS Feva, O'Pen Skiff, RS Quest, faster and more technical boats that have spinnaker or gennaker (except for O'Pen Skiff). To the objectives of the 1st level others add on: apparent and true wind, center of buoyancy and sailing center, complex sailing maneuvers, fine sails regulation, rig and conduction of spinnaker, reverse done sailing, first autonomous mooring and anchoring, fine work od mooring and pilotage.

Boats on this courses are equipped with a portable toilet.





Weekly keel boat itinerant courses:

ITINERANT COURSE Itinerant - one week course Boats: Nytec 23

Level 1: for first timers or less experienced sailors.

Level 2: for those who did the 1st level or have previous experience.

This course is the abbreviated version of the Coastal Navigation course, and its program and activities correspond to the second week only, which is the itinerant phase.

This course also takes your youngsters to the marvelous Bonifacio Strait, between the French islands and those of the National Park of the Maddalena Archipelago—one of the most beautiful places in the world. It combines the beauty of cruising with high-level educational content, teaching life onboard and maneuvering exclusively under sail—a crucial skill for those who aspire to become skilled sailors. On each boat, three students and their instructor sail from one island to another, stopping for a swim or lunch before reaching a wind-protected bay where they spend the night. The boats, moored close together, become one large home on the water. Evenings are spent in company and joy under the stars, and tomorrow, they're off to another destination! The spartan lifestyle demands adaptability from your youngsters, but in return, there's plenty of fun! In addition to sailing and coastal navigation, the course offers leisure, land excursions, and all the enjoyment of flotilla nautical camping. But it also ignites a new passion and adds a dash of maturity, autonomy, and responsibility that bring joy to both moms and dads.

FIRST LEVEL OBJECTIVES: nomenclature, knots, setting of the boat, conduction, maneuvers, line of boats, stopping in a set point, sail regulation, reduction of the sail's surface, navigation in safety, life as a crew, basics of anchoring and mooring, hints on pilotage .

SECOND LEVEL OBJECTIVES: We revisit the topics covered in the first level to delve into real and apparent wind, sail trim, center of effort, complex sail maneuvers, fine-tuning sail adjustments, rigging, spinnaker handling, sailing in reverse, initial landings, autonomous anchoring, refining mooring techniques. **Boats on this courses are equipped with a portable toilet.**

Level 1 - Itinerant - one week course Boats: A40, 12 meters keel boat

For those who did the 1st level or have previous experience.

The technical level rises, and the Blue Week takes place on the A40, a comfortable cabin cruiser equipped with cabins, kitchen, and bathroom, but more technical, fast, and high-performing. And it's the gennaker, a modern version of the spinnaker, that makes the difference in this course, along with maneuvers, moorings, anchorages, and dock arrivals in the most suggestive coves of the Strait of Bonifacio. Because in this course, more mature and conscientious, the young sailors are ready to take on the role of skipper, gaining a bit more autonomy, facing their first responsibilities, and learning from their own mistakes. The captains of tomorrow grow up quickly!

OBJECTIVES: complex maneuvers while sailing, fine sail setting, real and apparent wind, center of buoyancy and sailing center, setting and conduction of gennaker, sailing in rear, first autonomous mooring and anchoring, fine work on mooring and anchoring, hints on plotting the course, dead reckoning and coastal navigation.



Windsurf courses



In the wind paradise, could windsurfing be missing? Orza, in collaboration with Surf Star, schedules windsurfing courses capable of teaching your children to glide and enjoy all the adrenaline of this fantastic sport in a short time.

Theory and practice are combined using the experiential method, which has been thoroughly tested and proven effective in sailing courses, including those on the board. Qualified instructors not only convey the magic of water performance to young learners but also emphasize safety and the right approach to this sport, ensuring a truly comprehensive education. There are three different levels to accommodate all types of experience, from beginners to experts. And, upon request, one-to-one courses are available

BEGINNER COURSE

For those who are at their first experience

Theoretical lessons, simulator tests, fun exercises with extremely easy and light equipment, practice in the water... and fun guaranteed! After the course, the students can face the first outings safely with the board.

TOPICS COVERED: nomenclature and knowledge of the equipment in all its parts, how to rig and uncock the board, initiation on the simulator, wind and gaits, safety checks before going into the water, safety and the right behavior in the water, departure from the beach, basic maneuvers with the daggerboard, perfecting the gaits with light/medium wind.





IMPROVEMENT COURSE

For those who already have some experience

Off with the first emotions of speed! The wind to be faced will be medium/strong and this will allow you to perfect the basic maneuvers. The educational objectives of this level are the search for gliding and the right body position in fast paces and the use of the straps and the harness. From now on, fun knows no limits!

TOPICS COVERED: advanced theoretical notions, starting from the beach and correct pace with medium/strong wind, theory and tests starting from the water, quick tack and jibe without daggerboard, use of the trapeze and planning position, perfecting the beat.





FUNBOARD COURSE

For those who want to get serious!

The duggerboard disappears and here we are in the world of funboarding with Freeride boards! In this third phase of training you enter a different world, and everything you have learned must be brought to the new type of board. Freeride is pure joy.

TOPICS COVERED: correct starts and paces in strong winds, technique use of the harness and straps, body position and sail setting in all speeds optimization, jibing without daggerboard, in-depth analysis of the planing pace, board conduction with feet and weight, hints of power turns and fast turns on a freeride board, water start.

BOOKING AND PAYMENTS

After checking with the office the course availability:

- Advance payment within 3 days of 30% of the price of the course + membership fee + travel price (if required)
- Balance payment earlier then 30 days before the day of the beginning the course. If the enrollment is done within 30 days from the beginning of the course the balance is to be paid at the moment of enrollment.

TRAVEL ORGANIZED BY ORZA:

It's possible to choose to travel by group with an adult escort, the trip is organized by Orza. The itinerary involves taking a train from Milan to Genoa and a ferryboat to Olbia in Sardinia. From there the kids take the bus to our nautical base in Porto Pollo. The steps where you can entrust us your kids are:

- Milan, in the early hours of Friday afternoon at the Central Station
- Genoa, Friday afternoon at the train station or at the ferry station
- Olbia in Sardinia, early Saturday morning at the ferry station

The precise time of the appointment will be communicated on request by the office.

AUTONOMOUS ARRIVAL AT THE BASE

Orza nautical base is inside the Residence Blue Corner in Porto Pollo, in the municipality of Palau. It's 6 kilometers far from Palau and 45 kilometers from Olbia. Palau is connected to Olbia with frequent buses departing from the ferry station, the city and the airport.

On request, a taxi service can be arranged.

Beginning on the course/check-in: **Saturday around 12 am.** End of the course and departure from Porto Pollo: Friday around 5 pm.

FOR THOSE WHO DRIVES HERE OR TAKES A TAXI

The nautical base can be reached from the roads that connects Palau and Santa Teresa. After Palau turn right towards Isola dei Gabbiani, then proceed for 1 kilometer until the entrance of the **Blue Corner** that you will find on your right. Keep driving on the internal road and **follow the** signs for Orza Scuola Vela until you reach a square with a white tensile structure that will be on your left. VERY IMPORTANT INFO

THIS INFO CAN HELP YOU

Some equipment can be rented or bought directly at the nautical base: the list here written.

The life at the base is simple and informal, while making the luggage keep in mind to bring practical and comfortable clothes.

For the courses you need a small luggage: if you follow our instructions your kids won't need anything else.

We want to stress the importance of the sleeping bag, which is mandatory during the courses and strategic, if you travel with us, for the stay on the ferry to keep warm in the air conditioning.

For the kids who stay for more than one week, we organize a pizza night at the restaurant on Friday night.

Give your kids a little budget for anything the may need to rent or buy, for pizza, an evening ice-cream, and their meals on the ferry.

For those who come to the base before the beginning of the course, or want to leave some days after the end of the course, it is possible to be hosted in the nautical base prior asking for availability.

FOR THE ITINERANT COURSES (ITINERANT WEEK, AZURE WEEK, BLUE WEEK AND COASTAL NAVIGATION) YOU WILL HAVE TO ADD:

- Waterproof garments, better if including the trousers. For those who wish to buy it, a summertime waterproof gear is enough. Otherwise a k-way, or motorcycle gear can suffice as long as it protects from water and wind.
- Towel: instead of the traditional towels, consider a microfiber one as it is compact and easy to dry.
- Flashlight or head lamp

BOARD.

To store your things during the traveling week, add a backpack (preferably waterproof).

IT IS NOT POSSIBLE TO BRING TROLLEYS AND HARD BAGS ON

FOR THE COURSES HELD AT THE BASE (DINGHY, SKIFF AND WINDSURF) YOU WILL HAVE TO ADD:

- Dinghy wetsuit
- Lycra t-shirt or wetsuit-undergarments, only for those who tend to feel cold
- Neoprene dinghy boots
- Spray-top, only for the advanced courses – in which you spend more time in the water – or for those who tend to feel cold
- Kneepads, optional and suggested for whom has knee problems
- Sailing gloves

FOR THE TWO WEEKS LONG COASTAL NAVIGATION COURSE


